Background and overview

This is an on-paper assessment for initial accreditation of a Level 3 program leading to a Master of Professional Psychology to be offered at the Joondalup campus.



Key findings

The proposed program meets the majority of the criteria of the Australian Psychology Accreditation Council (APAC) 2019 Accreditation Standards. As the program is still in the planning stage, some Standards and criteria will require further monitoring to ensure that the program is rolling out as detailed in the Discipline's submission and continues to meet all Standards.



APAC Board determination

That Edith Cowan University's **Master of Professional Psychology** (Level 3) (Campus: Joondalup) program is accredited from **1 January 2021** until **31 December 2025** subject to the following conditions:

By **30 June 2021**:

1. To ensure Standard 2 Academic governance and quality assurance, criterion 2.2 is met, the Discipline is to provide a report to APAC providing evidence of the quality improvement processes being used for the program.
2. To ensure Standard 5 Assessment, criteria 5.1 and 5.2 are met, the Discipline is to provide a report to APAC demonstrating how all program learning outcomes will be assessed.

As a monitoring requirement, APAC requests that the Discipline submit a report including copies of logbooks when the first cohort of students has completed at least six months of the program to demonstrate that the program is rolling out as intended and it continues to meet the Accreditation Standards in particular, Standard 1 Public safety, criteria 1.8, 1.9 and 1.10.
